K9 Kopper: Bringing Home the Lost

In honor of Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month, Arcadia's shining a spotlight on a very special member of the Police Department, K9 Kopper. As a scent discrimination bloodhound, Kopper plays a crucial role in locating individuals who have wandered away due to cognitive impairments such as Alzheimer's or dementia.

Trained meticulously to track scents, his expertise is particularly invaluable in searching for adults, children, and individuals with mental disabilities. Since joining the police department in October 2022, K9 Kopper has had an outstanding record of success, locating 11 missing persons.



K9 Kopper in Action

In March 2024, K9 Kopper was sent to a home where an 80-year-old woman with memory loss had been missing for nearly 12 hours. After being provided a piece of the woman's clothing, Kopper followed the scent trail for half a mile. A concerned neighbor flagged down officers and confirmed a sighting of the woman matching the description in the area. Kopper continued his pursuit and ultimately discovered the woman having fallen into a gutter behind a locked gate. Thanks to Kopper, she received the assistance she needed and was reunited with her husband.

In addition to scent tracking, Kopper is also certified for patrol duty and undergoes regular training to ensure he is prepared for any situation he may encounter. His training exposes him to diverse environments, including challenges presented by snow and bodies of water. In recognition of his remarkable performance, Kopper and his handler have been awarded the Master Handler Certificate for their exceptional scent discriminate K9 trailing deployments.

In 2020, as many as 5.8 million Americans were living with Alzheimer's disease, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. It is projected that this number will nearly triple to 14 million people by 2060.



At the Arcadia Public Library, memory care kits are available for people with dementia, memory loss, or cognitive impairment, as well as their caregivers. The kits stimulate conversation, encourage healthy reminiscing, and provide support by giving users the opportunity to engage in discussion about their life experiences. Water Conservation

Outdoor watering is allowed two days per week, Tuesday and Saturday, in both summer and winter, between the hours of 6 p.m. and 9 a.m. Trees and perennial plants are exempt from these restrictions and are allowed to be watered by hand-held hose or drip irrigation. Commercial, Institutional, and Industrial water customers are still prohibited from watering non-functional turf.
