Addressing Homelessness in Arcadia

Homelessness is a difficult reality for many individuals. The City of Arcadia is dedicated to addressing the crisis by working closely with specialized agencies to provide emergency housing, employment opportunities, food assistance, and more.

The City of Arcadia contracts with Los Angeles Centers for Drug and Alcohol Abuse (L.A. CADA) for homeless case management, housing navigation, Prevention & Diversion Program allocation, and Emergency Services distribution. Through this contract, three dedicated Case Managers/Housing Navigators assist with outreach in the field, connections to mental health support services, substance abuse services, housing placement, and much more. Additionally, Case Managers support Arcadia community members with housing matters, reunification services, benefit connections, etc. One doesn't need to be experiencing homelessness to receive help.



During Fiscal Year (FY) 22-23, staff addressed 3,558 homelessness-related service calls, and invested over 5,000 hours in field checks, emergency responses, and administrative tasks.

To directly and indirectly support programs related to homelessness, the City of Arcadia spent \$1,176,259.48 in FY22-23.

The primary source of grant funding for these programs is Measure H, a 0.25% sales tax increase approved by Los Angeles County voters in 2017. From FY2017-23, Arcadia's sales tax generated and allocated to Measure H approximately \$16.8 million in revenues for homeless services countywide, and about \$662,000 has been returned directly to Arcadia to fund homeless programs. Other funding sources include the Permanent Local Housing Allocation, a program under Senate Bill 2, and a \$250,000 allocation from the American Rescue Plan Act.

Recent Success Stories

In partnership with L.A. CADA, Arcadia has provided individuals and families with the resources needed to rebuild their lives.



In November 2023, a mother and her 6 children faced homelessness after staying in a hotel for 5 months. Referred by the Foothill Unity Center, the outreach team met with the family and discovered they had a safe place to stay out of state but needed assistance getting there. The team extended their hotel stay, purchased plane tickets, provided jackets for the family, and organized transportation to the airport.

In May 2023, during a field visit, the outreach team encountered a woman and offered information about residential treatment options and free dental care. During a subsequent visit, they discovered she was living under the wash and in need of food and hygiene products. The team promptly provided these items, secured an emergency shelter bed, and provided transportation to the shelter.

In October 2022, after several months of assisting an individual, the outreach team witnessed significant strides in his recovery. The team fostered trust through consistent visits, assisting him in obtaining crucial items such as an ID, phone, and EBT card. With collaborative assistance from Union Station Homeless Services, he secured full-time employment at a restaurant and is working towards long-term housing.







