For the period of Sunday, August 23rd through Saturday, August 29th, the Police Department responded to 1,011 calls for service, of which 109 required formal investigations. The following is a summary report of some of the incidents handled by the Department during this period.

Sunday, August 23:

At approximately 1:49 p.m., an officer responded to a residence in the 900 block of West Foothill Boulevard regarding a burglary investigation. A review of the surveillance footage revealed four male suspects wearing hooded sweatshirts and gloves pried open a small window, ransacked the home, and fled with an unknown amount of property. They fled in a black SUV. The investigation is ongoing.

Monday, August 24:

At approximately 4:15 a.m., an officer responded to the 400 block of Cambridge Drive regarding the activation of a bait package tracking device that had been deployed to combat package thefts within the city. The suspect vehicle, later determined to be stolen, engaged in a brief pursuit. The pursuit was terminated and the vehicle was later located in Diamond Bar. An investigation revealed the driver of the stolen vehicle, a 38-year-old male from Diamond Bar, had two outstanding warrants. An accomplice, a 41-year-old female from Norwalk, was arrested for stealing the vehicle, having a falsified driver's license, smuggling a controlled substance into jail, and for committing identity theft. Two additional suspects fled on foot and the investigation is ongoing to determine their identities.

Tuesday, August 25:

At approximately 1:21 p.m., an officer responded to Cosmo Prof, located at 332 East Huntington Drive, regarding a grand theft report. An investigation revealed two suspects entered the business and stole nearly \$1,300.00 worth of hair products. The officer discovered the 2 Hispanic females were seen at the Pasadena Cosmo Prof earlier in the day. Both suspects are described as females in their 30's, approximately 5' tall.

Wednesday, August 26:

At approximately 7:06 p.m., an officer responded to Foot Locker, located at 400 South Baldwin Avenue, regarding a petty theft report. The officer determined two unidentified male suspects entered the business and stole clothing valued at \$90.00. Both suspects are described as being Hispanic, in their early 40s, and approximately 5'5" to 5'8" in height.

Thursday, August 27:

At approximately 2:34 p.m., an officer responded to Royal Oaks Liquor, located at the intersection of First Avenue and Haven Avenue, regarding a grand theft report. Sometime between 2:29 a.m. and 3:45 p.m., someone stole a bicycle from the location. The stolen bicycle was located nearby and the suspect riding the bike, a 24-year-old male from Monrovia, was arrested. He was transported to the Arcadia City Jail for booking.

Friday, August 28:

At approximately 2:46 a.m., an officer responded to ZLL Warehouse, located at 11680 Goldring Road, regarding an attempted commercial burglary. An investigation revealed three unidentified suspects destroyed a motion activated outdoor light and used a truck to ram into a roll-up food in an attempt to burglarize the business. The suspects failed to make entry and no loss was reported. Surveillance cameras captured the suspects wearing hooded sweatshirts and long pants. The investigation is ongoing.

Saturday, August 29:

At approximately 2:31 p.m., an officer responded to AM/PM, located at 625 Las Tunas Drive, regarding a robbery report. The officer determined the suspect, a 41-year-old female from Palmdale, stole merchandise and food. As she attempted to flee, she was confronted by the store employee and subsequently threw a drink in the employee's face. She was located, arrested, and transported to the Arcadia City Jail for booking.
