## Paramedic Membership Program Offers Savings Opportunity

Emergency paramedic care and ambulance transportation are among the essential services the City of Arcadia provides its residents. The cost of these services is tied to rates established by Los Angeles County and can run well over \$1,000 per patient. However, by joining the City's Paramedic Membership Program,

residents and business owners will not incur any out-of-pocket expenses in the event of an accident or illness requiring emergency medical services provided by the Arcadia Fire Department within City borders. There is no prequalification requirement for the program except that you reside or own a business in the City of Arcadia.



The annual residential membership fee is \$51 per household (\$27/retirement home residents, \$24/qualified low-income residents). Membership is also available to businesses in the City ranging from \$54 to \$174 per year. Please visit the City website or call 574-5126 to obtain an application or additional information.

## Historic Resource Survey Underway



The City, along with Architectural Resources Group, Inc., a Pasadena firm that specializes in historic preservation, is conducting a citywide historic resource survey to gather information to determine which buildings, structures, and sites within the community have special historic, cultural and architectural significance.

This is the City's first comprehensive, citywide survey to document significant historic resources, potential landmarks, and potential historic districts. The survey will enable the City to gain a better understanding of where significant historic resources are located and to plan for their preservation. The survey is being conducted now, and all of the surveying

is done outside of the buildings.

It is important to note that the results from this portion of the survey are for planning and information gathering purposes only and will not necessarily result in immediate landmark designations of any buildings, nor will it impact property tax rates or assessed values by the L.A. County Assessor's Office.
